FAQ's

What finish is the paint in your sample pots?

Our sample pot paint is Interior Paint, which has a matt finish.

Are all 70 colours available in both Interior and Exterior paint?

Yes.

Can I use Exterior paint inside?

Yes. Exterior paint is highly specified, making it outstandingly tough and durable. Used indoors it is very useful for areas of high traffic and kitchen and bathroom cabinets and woodwork.

Why do you say Marstons Premium Paints is the best available?

Our paint base is of a high industrial standard, being outstandingly tough and durable and with exceptional elasticity – allowing considerable natural movement. Many paint ranges create their colours using just a few tints, but we use fourteen superior and fadeless pigments, resulting in colours with subtlety and depth

Does your paint have a RAL number?

The RAL colour standard is a system whereby a numbered colour specification can be re-created absolutely accurately across industries. With Marstons Premium Paints we wanted to create a completely original colour range, and these have been designed and mixed from scratch so that the colours have a subtlety and individuality which is entirely our own. Part of our mission is to offer colours which work well with all architectural materials, and also colours that can be combined and complement each other. For this reason our colours do not have a RAL number.

How do I achieve a good finish?

It is generally agreed that a good paint finish comes from 75% preparation of the surfaces, and 25% application. Our paint is a pleasure to apply, and being water-based it is simple to clean up afterwards. For brushwork synthetic fibre brushes are recommended

Why should I use a synthetic fibre brush?

The main advantage of synthetic fibre over natural brushes is that the fibres do not swell with water, thus reducing brush marks and thereby improving the finish and speeding up the job. In addition, the specially hammered finish on our synthetic-fibre brush gives the ultimate finish.

Do I need a primer for new plaster walls?

No, paint can usually be applied direct.
